Grandparents Grieve, Too

When a couple loses a baby, oftentimes they are the only ones whose grief is acknowledged by others. The sorrow of the rest of the family tends to get overlooked. Aunts, uncles and cousins of the baby certainly feel the loss as well, but typically not at the same magnitude as the parents of the grieving couple, also known as the baby's grandparents.

Both Byron's and my parents grieved deeply for the losses we had. They mourned not only for the two grandchildren they lost, but also for us as their children. It hurt them tremendously to see us in such heartache and pain, knowing they could not do anything to make it better. If you have a living child at home then you know that there is nothing you wouldn't do to protect him from harm and shield him from hurt. That aspect of parenting never goes away, no matter how old we are. It is an extremely helpless feeling for our parents, and over the years of directing M.E.N.D. I have seen a variety of ways in which grandparents deal with this unique emotion.

Most bereaved moms and dads have expressed the sensitivity their parents showed them during the aftermath of their loss. One of our moms who regularly attends our support groups lost her baby Gabriela two years ago. Her father, who is not young in years, regularly visits his granddaughter's grave and helps the cemetery's maintenance crew by trimming the overgrown grass with cutting shears and pulling weeds that have grown on her grave. I am overcome with emotion every time I envision this sweet man on his hands and knees lovingly caring for Gabriela in the only way he can on this earth.

Some grandparents have gone to great measures to find help and comfort for their children. It never ceases to amaze me when I receive a phone call or email from a tearful grandparent desperately seeking information on infant loss and help for their hurting children. Several years ago I got a despondent call

India had gone to live with her mom, who lives a few hours away, hoping that being near family would help her during the grieving process. While there, India had an emotional breakdown that greatly frightened her mother. India's mom thought getting her daughter to the M.E.N.D. support group that night would be good for her. She did everything she could to put India on a flight to Dallas that afternoon in order to get her to our share time. Although her efforts were fruitless in getting India to the group, I'll never forget the extra mile this grandmother walked to seek help for her hurting daughter.

While these two stories are very touching, I could use the space of this entire newsletter reporting events that are not so heartwarming. Like the grandmother who threw away the pictures of her deceased grandchild because her husband said they were too morbid to have in the house. Or when the young couple came to a support group expressing regret that they let their parents talk them out of seeing their stillborn baby due to superstition of having bad luck if they saw a dead person. And of the sobbing, grief-stricken daughter whose mother told her not to call again until she was over the loss of her pregnancy. While these cases are rare, they do occur. I want to believe these grandparents are not as cruel as these accounts make them out to be. Instead I think sweeping the loss under the rug, so to speak, is their way of dealing with the death. Although extremely unhealthy, not facing death and not allowing the bereaved to talk about it is very old school, and unfortunately many grandparents don't know any differently. They believe if they portray a sense of apathy over the loss it will help their children get on with their lives quicker. I wish I could sit down with them and make them understand how harmful this is and that they are risking forever having a bad relationship with their children.

One mistake I have seen families make after a loss is to compare their grief. Certainly after the death of a baby no one hurts more than the parents, whose lives will never again be the same. But we cannot discount the immense suffering the grandparents go through as well. We all must grieve together and realize that even though we're grieving over the same loss, it's a different kind of ache for each of us, and getting through the tough times will be much easier if we agree to heal together.

To My Dear Daughter

With the holidays approaching again, I know this is a difficult time of year for you and David. Christmas is such a family-centered holiday, so focused around children, that I am sure your empty arms ache once again. Though you are delighted to have a niece and a nephew (as we are delighted to be grandparents), still it must be very hard to watch the fulfillment your brother and sister-in-law are experiencing as they delight in their son and daughter.

Moms are supposed to be able to make the hurts go away for their kids. As your mother, I would do anything I could to alleviate your pain in this regard. But this is one time when all I can do is pray. Ever since you were a little girl, I dreamed of the time when you would have kids. I have a lot of trouble understanding God's purpose in withholding this blessing from you (and from me). It is very painful to even share these things with you because I don't want to increase your feelings of sadness or inadequacy. Still, maybe it helps for you to know that I do weep with you and share the deep disappointment of your infertility.

One thing God has been teaching me through all of this is that there is a purpose to suffering. The fore-most longing of our hearts should always be about knowing and trusting God. It's easy when things are going well to believe that God is good and His purposes are being fulfilled. It's not so easy to continue to believe when life is difficult and things do not go the way we had hoped they would go.

Knowing that God is working all things together for good to those of us who are called to be His is also followed by the fact that we are "predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:28-29). You are so right when you remind me that Jesus did suffer on our behalf far more than we will ever suffer. If we are to become like Him, suffering is often the means by which we are refined. God has, indeed, "blessed us with every spiritual blessing ... in Christ" (Ephesians 1:3). But it is also important that we learn to "count it all joy," (James 1:2) when we face the trials of this life because we have the confidence that God is doing His perfect work so that we may be "complete, lacking nothing" (James 1:5).

...In closing, I just want to say how proud (in a good sense) I am to be your mom. Your godliness and gentleness are a source of encouragement to me. I am exceedingly thankful for the times we can talk together about the promises of Scripture and the goodness of the Lord. I am glad God has blessed you with a godly husband, and pleased that together you have established a home where He is honored.

I want you to know that whether or not God blesses you with children (either biologically or through adoption), you will always be dear to my heart. Though I may be disappointed at times with the path God has asked you to walk, I am not and never will be disappointed with you. I count it a privilege that we are partners together in "the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3).





A letter from Alfred, Lord Tennyson, to his friend Robert Monteith, after the stillbirth of Tennyson's child in 1851

My dear Robert,

I am quite sure you feel with me. My poor little boy got strangled in being born. I would not send the notice of my misfortune to the *Times* and I have had to write some 60 letters. If you desire to know about it ask Edmund Lushington to show you that letter which I wrote to him. My wife has been going on very well since; but last night she lost her voice and I thought I should lose her: she's however free from all danger this morning according to my medical man. I have suffered more than ever I thought I could have done for a child still-born: I fancy I should not have cared so much if he had been a seven months splindling, but he was the grandest-looking child I had ever seen. Pardon my saying this. I do not speak only as a father but as an Artist—if you do not despise the word from German associations. I mean as a man who has eyes and can judge from seeing.

I refused to see the little body at first, fearing to find some pallid abortion which would have haunted me all my life—but he looked (if it be not absurd to call a newborn babe so) even majestic in his mysterious slice after all the turmoil of the night before.

He was—not born, I cannot call it born for he never breathed—but he was released from the prison where he moved for nine months on Easter Sunday. Awful day! We live close upon an English-church chapel. The organ rolled—the psalm sounded—and the wail of a woman in her travail—of a true and tender nature suffering, as it seemed intolerable wrong, rose ever and anon.
