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As I sat at my desk brainstorming about what to write for this issue, I tried to remember what I did last year for Mother's Day. I thought and thought but could not remember. Just as I was about to search for my 2005 calendar, hoping it would jog my memory, it hit me. We were out of town for Mother's Day last year. Our son, Byron Jr., had a baseball tournament in Shreveport, Louisiana.

It was very strange to not be home, go to church, eat lunch with my mom, sisters, their families, and everything else we traditionally do on this day. Then again, Mother's Day hasn't been the same since 1996, which was my first Mother's Day after losing Jonathan. But Mother's Day last year was really different for me. Instead of getting up early Sunday morning and rushing to church, we awoke in a hotel room, threw on our sweats and rushed to the ball field.

I sat in my folding chair, snuggled beneath my fleece blanket, put on my sunglasses, and peoplewatched. Certainly I watched my son play ball, but I also observed those around me. I noticed most parents intently paid attention to the games, many of them coaching their children from the sidelines (and some making fools of themselves!). A few people ate hot dogs at ten o-clock in the morning, and a handful read the paper or a book, appearing completely uninterested in their children. What struck me the most though, were all the dads who were there without the moms. This was a tournament in which the vast majority of teams traveled out of state, or at least a few hours.

So, it was safe to assume the absent moms were not sleeping in at the Holiday Inn; they simply were not there

In all fairness, some moms may have had very good excuses for not traveling to Shreveport with their sons. Still, I wondered how many of these ladies just wanted a day alone to do their own thing? I tried to not harshly judge these missing mothers and reasonably rationalized that coming to a ball tournament may have been an absolute impossibility for them. But it just didn't fly with me. I imagined myself lining them all up and introducing them to the thousands of heartbroken mommies that morning who did not have a child at home with whom to share this honorable day. I wanted to tell them about how quickly our children grow up; we parents should not miss a single event. Further, I questioned what mother would want to spend Mother's Day without her child? However, as the day wore on, my heart softened, and I realized that this was just another lesson my little Jonathan has taught me. As mothers who have lost children we "get it." We know and understand how to cherish life, treasure each day, and not take the little things (even a ball tournament) for granted.

This Mother's Day, even if your heart is broken, embrace the day! Honor your mother, encourage those around you to spend time with the special women in their lives, and be thankful for each day we have with those we love.

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### Being a Mother

"As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; and you will be comforted over Jerusalem." Isaiah 66:13

One thing that occurred to me this morning at about 5:00 as my two-year-old coughed, sneezed, whispered, tossed, and turned beside me, was that Mother's Day is all about honoring mothers for the sacrifices they make for their children. I do feel I sacrifice quite a bit of time, energy, and sleep for my two living sons. But it haunts me sometimes that I never have to do anything for my youngest son, Joseph. He is in God's care now, and my job is done.

Or is it? Just because my son isn't living here on earth, does that make me less of a mother? I don't change his diapers or feed him. I don't sing him lullabies or read him stories. But I love him, just as if he were here with me. And that is what being a mother is all about. All those sacrifices result from our love for our children, and that love doesn't change when our children aren't with us anymore.

As a matter of fact, I sometimes think that losing a child to death gives us a greater glimpse into true love than others have the chance to receive. After all, the greatest love in the world is the love that God has for us. We can't fathom a love that deep, but perhaps having a child die brings us closer to understanding it than we would otherwise. After all, God gave His Son in death for us. Think about that. Would you have willingly sacrificed your child for people who don't even love you, people who don't know your child at all? I don't think I could have. I didn't willingly give Joseph up. I held onto him with all my might, kicking and screaming that his death was very unfair. Yet, God let Jesus be taken by an angry mob to a cruel, painful death. He willingly sacrificed His Son for me. He loved me that much.

And that's one thing I'm so very thankful for this Mother's Day. Yes, I'd much rather have Joseph here with me, but God has shown me that his little life is precious. Through Joseph, I've learned what love is really all about. And my love for him makes me just as much a mother as anybody else who holds her child dear to her heart. Through my son, I have greater appreciation for God's Son. I have a much clearer understanding of the vastness of my Father's love for me, a love that comforts me "as a mother comforts her child."

So rejoice in your love for your children today. Your job isn't done. Keep loving them. That is what makes you a mother, and that is what today is all about. ♥



## A Father's Perspective

by Byron Mitchell

Our second son, Jonathan, was stillborn due to a cord accident on June 24, 1995. Many of the following days were a difficult time of understandable disbelief, heart-breaking grief, and soul-searching. Today I'd like to address this struggle from a father's perspective.

I internalized my grief early on because that is how I tend to deal with deep things. I stayed so busy with my business and other commitments that burying my feelings became the natural way for me to deal with it all. Even so, there were many times when grief would just hit me while at my office or driving my car. I would dwell on Jonathan and become quietly emotional and tears would well up in my eyes - but others rarely knew what I was going through. I think that most men probably grieve in this way, holding our feelings inside and being somewhat uncomfortable when situations arise that make us deal with the emotions we're trying to keep under control.

In a different way, I believe that fathers also grieve over the realization that family life will never again be the same. I know that I felt this way. For me, it was truly troubling that we would never and could never get back to normal. But as Rebekah says, we now go "forward to normal" because there is no going back. And to be honest, I want to see life in its true colors, not one of fantasy or idyllic thinking for God never promised a life of pain-free utopian living.

In James 1:12, it reads "Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love Him." And because of the assurance of His love, we can all rest in knowing that God understands our grief as fathers and mothers and gives us the strength and peace to endure this most difficult time in our lives. ♥
