



Mommies Enduring Neonatal Death

Mother's Day and Father's Day

Oftentimes the title of "mother" is only given to the one who physically gave birth to and/or raised a child in her home. However, Webster's Dictionary defines a mother as one who "cares for and protects."

Commonly around Mother's Day and Father's Day parents who lost their only children struggle with the identity of whether or not they are truly parents. My answer to that question is always a resounding, "Yes!" We may not have been given the privilege of rearing our babies who died, but certainly we cared for and did our best to protect them from harm.

I have learned that it is absolutely not necessary to be biologically related to those we deem our "children" or to those we may consider our "second parents." When my twin sister Rachael and I were two years old, a very special woman, Annie Mae Allen, became a part of our family. The titles "housekeeper," "maid," and even "nanny" are too demeaning in my opinion to label our Annie Mae. Rachael and I are several years younger than the older four kids in our family. So when Annie Mae came to us, they were in school all day, but we were home with her while our mom was busy driving carpool, grocery shopping, and everything else a mother of six is responsible for.

I was the more mischievous of the two twins and was affectionately called "wildcat" by Annie Mae. Rachael, on the other hand, was the sweet, quiet one. More times than I can count Annie Mae rescued me from the top of a tree, cleaned my kitchen concoctions, and endured my spunky tricks. Her protectiveness wouldn't let us walk home from school in elementary or stay home alone in junior high. In high school she gave us boyfriend approval (or not) and made sure potential boyfriends knew they would have to deal with her, if necessary. She mourned with my mother as if we had died when we went off to college. The weekends we came home, she sweetly came to the house on Saturday just to see us. At all six of our weddings she was ushered down the aisle and seated as a mother. She helped bathe us, feed us, and tend to us when we were sick. She sat in the waiting room for hours when I had a kidney transplant. When Rachael

and I both had two high risk pregnancies that required bed rest, she lovingly worked alongside our mom pampering and spoiling us as we prepared to become mothers ourselves.

When my little Jonathan was stillborn, Annie Mae mourned his loss like the rest of my family. She rode in the limousine to his funeral and sat under the big tent with us as my twin buried her head underneath Annie Mae's comforting arm. Just before the service was officially over, she escorted Byron and me back to the house because I wasn't up to greeting all the guests.

As I write this, it has been just over 24 hours since Annie Mae joined my sweet babies in heaven. My mom, Rachael, and I were able to spend many hours with her during the last weeks of her life. Joining with her biological children, we loved her, kissed on her, and thanked her for the many years she spent caring for and protecting us. The last day of her life the three of us got to say our final goodbye just hours before she met her "sweet Jesus." Minutes after her passing we were able to love on her again. I gently caressed the arms and hands that had hugged me, patted on me, bathed me, rubbed down my high fevers, prepared snacks for me, and years later loved my baby, changed his diapers, and cared for him. Now Annie Mae is undoubtedly loving my two babies in heaven. I hope she has been given many rewards for caring for their wildcat mommy.

Assuredly this will be another different Mother's Day for me. I will recognize my mother, be celebrated by my son, think of my children in heaven, and for the first time, honor the memory of my Annie Mae.

Book Review

Mourning Sarah

A case for testing group B strep By Theresa Huttllinger Vigour www.radcliffe-oxford.com

Author Theresa Vigour describes her journey of infertility, multiple miscarriages, and the heartbreaking loss of her newborn daughter, Sarah. The reader may find it difficult to not become extremely infuriated by the lack of care and consideration Vigour was given from several physicians and nurses. Sarah's death probably could have been prevented had the medical team listened to her well-informed and educated mother who desperately attempted several times to explain symptoms and abnormal pain she was experiencing.

Although Sarah's death occurred in 1981 and healthcare providers have taken great strides to help prevent infant death resulting from group B strep. Mourning Sarah is a must-read for parents who lost a baby to this same bacteria so they will know what to insist on for a subsequent pregnancy. Additionally, all those who work in healthcare should read this to ensure the outdated protocol Vigour describes is no longer practiced in their places of employment.

Medical Moment



A systematic review examining the effects of therapeutic radioactive iodine on ovarian function and future pregnancy in female thyroid cancer survivors.

Background: For women with differentiated thyroid carcinoma (DTC), the effect of radioactive iodine (RAI) therapy on gonadal and reproductive function is an important consideration.

Objective and Methods: We systematically reviewed controlled studies examining the gonadal and reproductive effects of RAI therapy in women and adolescents surviving DTC. We searched nine electronic databases. All abstracts and papers were independently reviewed by two reviewers.

Results: After reviewing 349 unique citations and 61 full-text papers, sixteen papers including data from 3023 women or adolescents with DTC, were included. All studies were observational, with no long-term randomized control trial data. The age at first RAI treatment varied from 8 to 50 years and the cumulative activities of RAI administered for treatment varied from 30 to 1099 mCi. Transient absence of menstrual periods occurred in 8 to 27% of women within the first year after RAI, particularly in older women. Also, RAI-treated women experienced menopause at a slightly younger age than women not treated with RAI. In the first year after RAI therapy, several studies reported increased rates of spontaneous and induced abortions. However, RAI treatment for DTC was generally not associated with a significantly increased risk of long-term infertility, miscarriage, induced abortions, stillbirths, or offspring neonatal mortality or congenital defects.

Conclusions: In female survivors of DTC, there is little observational evidence to suggest important adverse effects of RAI treatment on gonadal function, fertility, or pregnancy outcomes beyond 12 months, with the exception of a possible slightly earlier age of menopause.



The Poem

"All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." This beautiful passage taken from Psalms 139:13-16 is a comforting reminder to my husband and me that God had His plan for our daughter, Fallon Elise, before she was ever born, just as He has His plan for each and every one of us.

It had been just days since we had the funeral service. My husband brought in the stack of mail that contained several handwritten envelopes. For the past week and a half, we had been receiving sympathy cards on a daily basis...such an outpouring of love...every card, letter, and floral enclosure card now a cherished treasure kept in a box so full the lid must be tied to keep it closed. Among the cards received that day was a larger envelope. This was one of those legal-sized manila envelopes with a metal clasp on the seal.

As I opened the envelope to remove the contents, the pages were turned over, and I could see handwriting through the upside-down page. I immediately recognized this handwriting. It was my mother's handwriting. My mind briefly swirled with confusion, because my mother had gone to be with our Lord years ago, on June 22, 2001. Turning the stack of three pages over, I found on top a letter from my cousin, Gene's wife Ruthie.

"Gene and I are so sorry to hear of your loss. As soon as I heard about your baby, I remembered this poem that your mother had written for us when our baby passed away. I have enclosed a copy of the original for you..."

The second page was a poem typed in pink script on beautiful parchment paper. Ruthie had copied the poem written by my mother and personalized it with my daughter Fallon's name in the fourth of its six stanzas. The bottom of the poem said, "Love, Karen." Karen was my mother. I wept as I read each meaningful line, feeling as though my mother was right there comforting me with her very own words. I was overwhelmed with emotion, but I also felt the warm love of my mother that I needed so much during this time of grief. I knew this was not an accident. I knew that God in His perfect wisdom had reminded Ruthie of this poem my mother had written for her and Gene on the occasion of the death of their baby daughter, Jamie Lynn, fifteen years earlier on June 30, 1993. Ruthie knew that she was to now send it to me and my husband.

The third page was the photo copy of the original poem that my mother had written so many years ago in the beautiful handwriting that I had immediately recognized. I read her words again, this time with Jamie's name in the fourth stanza as it was first written. I cried reading my mother's thoughtful words, remembering her sweet and caring spirit, thinking how precious she was to write this comforting message to Gene and Ruthie. I also couldn't help but think, "God knew she was writing this to me, too—even fifteen years ago!" God knew "as He knit her in her mother's womb" that my mother would die when she was 56, when I was 34 years old, and He knew "as He was knitting her in my womb" that my first child, Fallon, would be stillborn when I was 41.

God also knew in 1993, when my mother was writing this poem, how much I would need her love and comfort so many years later, though she would not be here in person to give it. He already had His plan. I never knew about this poem my mother had written, and she had no idea at the time what the future would hold for me or that her words were being written for me and my husband as well as for Ruthie and Gene...but God did.

My husband Kent said, "I feel like I know your mother a little more now," after reading her words. Both of our mothers, Karen and Marie, had passed away in 2001, as did Kent's father Ray in April 2002, before we met in June 2002. We've always felt like our moms met in heaven and worked with God to plan that the two of us would meet. Among her many other purposes, we also wonder if perhaps Fallon was created as a very special gift to her grandmas and granddad in heaven. That may be just the kind of incredible presents God gives in heaven. We can only imagine until it is all explained to us in Glory. We do know a part of our DNA is already in the presence of God and she is well taken care of for eternity! We will hold her in heaven!

What a beautiful girl and gift from God that Fallon was, and what a blessing she continues to be in our lives! God carried us through the tragedy of her stillbirth and He continues to bless our lives. We now wait with great expectancy and trust in Him. We trust in His plan for us and for the arrival of Fallon's little brother this July.

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." Ps 139:13-16

Watching A Father's Grief

So often over the last six years, I've taken for granted my husband's grief. Selfishly, I have focused more on what Mother's Day means for me than what Father's Day means for him.

Each year, Jonathan has gone out of his way to ensure that Mother's Day is exactly what I do—or don't—want it to be. Even after all these years, he recently asked me if I was okay with being on vacation visiting family in California on Mother's Day rather than here where I can go to the cemetery.

Obviously, Mother's Day and Father's Day are difficult for both of us. After losing two children, I thought it couldn't get any worse. Then we unexpectedly lost Jon's father to a heart attack—two hours before Father's Day 2005.

Now my husband is not only grieving the two children he has in heaven, but also his father—the grandfather our subsequent daughter Madison would never get to meet. But his grief is so much different than mine! He's not a blubbering mess on Father's Day, as I so often have been on Mother's Day. He makes plans for big barbeques and family events; I want to be alone, and before Maddie came, I surely didn't want to be around any children.

After nearly 13 years of marriage, I can see the occasional far-off stare, and I'm certain that his thoughts are lingering on who's missing from the celebration. But his thoughts don't last long, and when I ask if there's something wrong or if he'd like to visit the cemetery where his father's buried, he simply says with a smile, "No, I'm doing okay. When are the brats going to be ready?"

It occurs to me that these differences in how Mother's Day and Father's Day affect men and women are not too different from every other day we are grieving. Men and women simply grieve in different ways, and these two holidays are just poignant reminders of that fact. Many times since we lost Caleb, August, and even Grandpa Raymond, I've seen my reactions and Jon's in such stark contrast to each other. I'm crying and then angry and then guilty. He's angry and then proactive and then humorous.

Whatever the differences, I've seen us both grow in our grief. We are taking those unique responses to our pain and loss and turning them into love and support for others who are walking this road behind us. Just last week I had a woman ask me, "Did Jon just get over this faster than you? My husband seemed to be okay after a few weeks, and I'm still a mess." I'm always clear to point out that while men and women grieve differently, none of us "get over this"—we "get through it." And yes, there seems to be a different timeline for men and women, but the Lord created us all with these characteristics and wants us to bring our pain to Him. He knows it already and can give us peace and contentment when we seek it.
