Creating a Legacy for Your Child—Don't Waste Your Grief

Jonathan's Legacy

Not long after my husband, Byron, and I were married, I was diagnosed with a degenerative kidney disease. A couple of years later, after several consultations with my doctors, we decided to start a family. I battled a few complications with my first pregnancy, but despite medical statistics, our son, Byron, Jr., was born full-term and healthy.

When we became pregnant a second time, three years later, I found myself a little more apprehensive and nervous that this baby might not make it to term. For some reason, every day I caught myself placing my hands on my growing belly and praying that this baby would be even more of a miracle than his brother. I imagined that Jonathan would require a premature delivery, resulting in his spending some time in the NICU. I prayed that the medical professionals taking care of him would not be able to deny the healing power of the Lord. Additionally, I prayed that Jonathan's life would touch countless lives and that many would come to Jesus by witnessing or hearing his testimony.

Throughout my praying that prayer every day of the 29 1/2 weeks that I was able to carry my baby boy, never in a million years did I dream he would die. I had great confidence that God was going to answer my fervent prayers for His glory. So when it was discovered that Jonathan's tiny heart had stopped beating while I was on bed rest in the hospital, I was in complete shock and disbelief. The umbilical cord wrapping around my baby's head, body, and left leg was definitely not part of the plan!

In the midst of my deep sorrow and heartache, I remember saying to the Lord numerous times, "Surely You have a plan. Surely good will come from this!" After many months of intense grieving, I finally got to the place where I could earnestly say, "Okay, God, what do I do with this? I know Jonathan's life was not in vain. It must have had a purpose." Over time, God began to birth within me His

plan. A little more than a year after Jonathan's stillbirth, M.E.N.D. was formed.

Today, 15 years later, we have grown into a national ministry, with chapters all over Texas, and several other states. In fact, as I write this article, I just got off a ferry and am sitting in a Starbucks located in the most northwestern part of the United States, about to speak at M.E.N.D.—NW Washington's first Christmas candlelight ceremony. I am in awe of every adventure the Lord takes me on to spread Jonathan's story.

The prayers I prayed over my baby actually were answered, just not the way I thought or wanted them to be. So many years later, I can most assuredly see how God answered them His way. I am confident that many lives have been touched by Jonathan—likely far more through his death than through his life. And I continue to pray that countless are led to the Lord by hearing of our journey and being ministered to through M.E. N.D.

All of our support groups conclude with opening the floor and inviting the families in attendance to share something good or positive that has resulted from their losses. Basically, we are encouraging the families to create legacies for their babies. I love hearing the variety of sweet stories that are shared during this special time. If you have yet to create a legacy for your baby, I strongly encourage you to think of one good thing that you can attribute to your loss. Maybe it's a reconciled relationship, or possibly now you find that you are more sensitive to the hurts of others and have been able to comfort another hurting person. If you are so fresh in your grief that you truly cannot think of a single good thing yet, that's okay. Just know that your loss was not in vain, and I am confident that someday your grief will be used to honor your little baby and glorify the Lord

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The Journey Through the Valley of the Shadow

My thoughts of God have been forever changed, that is how it is when you come face to face with the magnitude of His infinite grace and love—when you are consumed by it. For there are times in this life where we must surrender it all, laying ourselves out on the altar—and at this time our Father steps down from His throne to gently pick up His children and whisper His love. In looking to our Lord we discovered a more beautiful world—a world that is spiritual and beyond description. In Christ's love, even the most desperate situations become bearable, and we could see the hand of God and the grace that was being lavishly poured on us at every turn.

Because of this journey we created a blog that chronicles our journey. It is the truth of imperfect people in a harsh world facing terrible odds depending on a perfect God that chose His loss so that we could be redeemed. It is the journey that has brought us closer into fellowship with God's grace and has left us forever changed.

In this journey it is my hope that my life has been made more beautiful because of the suffering.

Support Groups on the Internet: A Study of On-line Support Groups

Ann Arbor, Michigan—The methods of grieving a child have vastly changed over the years, from it being a taboo topic to women sharing confidentially with each other to support groups to the latest trend, the Internet. The Department of Family Medicine and the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Michigan conducted a study to learn about the demographics, usage patterns and perceived benefits for women participating in Internet pregnancy loss support groups. Most women expressed satisfaction with the pregnancy loss boards.

There are a large number of support sites available, but little research has been conducted on the users or roles of the boards in handling grief. The University of Michigan conducted an on-line survey of various Internet sites. The focus was on websites that served women with stillbirth only or women with either stillbirth or miscarriage. The survey was kept open until there was a minimum of 1,000 responses to obtain an adequate range of experiences, which took an eight-month period to obtain. The survey was anonymous. Fifteen sites agreed to post a link to the survey on a total of 18 message boards. Message boards included sites for miscarriage and stillbirth, women pregnant or trying to conceive after a loss, recurrent losses, elective termination of pregnancy, loss due to a medical cause and a board for bereaved teens dealing with loss.

Most women felt that the message boards helped with handling the loss. The most common theme was the realization that women were not alone in their losses. Women found others who had been through similar situations and could understand what it felt like. Many losses are minimized or unacknowledged by friends, families and communities, while these online communities understood the need to talk about the losses and deceased children, which was another theme that appeared. These communities created an acceptable environment to talk about a deceased baby and talking of grief was "normal." Using the message boards was also easy and convenient for women. While a support group may only meet once or twice a month, the message boards were available 24/7, which allowed women to express their grief any time. If they were having a bad day and could not find the energy to get to a support group, they had the opportunity to express their feelings on the board and have others respond without leaving home.

Some women told that they were able to find hope and coping skills through the message boards. They were given reassurance from others that they could survive the grief because others had survived. Some also learned new medical information to aid them

The study also showed that there are some areas lacking on message groups. Most women felt that the boards needed a leader, moderator or facilitator, and also a professional health care worker.

Overall, the study showed the importance of these message boards to grieving women. It is a way to reach others who have been in similar situations and can understand the pain and grief whenever the mother is in need.



Las oraciones que ore por mi bebé realmente fueron respondidas, solo que, no como yo lo pensaba o quería. Tantos años después, seguramente puedo ver cómo Dios respondió a su manera. Estoy segura de que muchas vidas han sido afectadas por Jonathan - probablemente mucho más a través de su muerte que a través de su vida. Y sigo orando para que sean incontables las personas que llegan conocer al Señor por escuchar acerca de nuestro viaje e igual son ministrados a través de

O posiblemente ahora se da cuenta de que es más sensible a las heridas de los demás y han sido capases de consolar a otra persona en sufrimiento. Si esta tan tranquila en su dolor que verdaderamente no puede pensar en una sola cosa buena aún, está bien. Solo sepa que su pérdida no fue en vano, y confio en que algún día su aflicción se utilizará para honrar a su pequeño bebé y para glorificar al Señor.
