Mother's Day

Mother's Day is the second Sunday in May, a day when women all over the United States celebrate their moms and are celebrated themselves, if they, too, are mothers of living children. However, this day is excruciatingly difficult for women who have lost a child, suffer with infertility, and/or have experienced the death of their mom.

Those of us who have endured the death of a baby, even if we have one or more living children, do not want to ruin this special holiday for the naively blissful women who have never experienced loss. But we do ask that the painful emotion be somewhat acknowledged, especially in our churches, where the celebration seems to be the greatest, yet what should be a sanctuary for the hurting. Countless women opt out of attending worship services on this particular Sunday, simply because thev find acknowledgement of the moms with the most children, the oldest mom, and other such "awards" just too painful to sit through. They do not know if they should stand up when moms are acknowledged, accept a rose from the smiling usher, or "count" the baby they lost when questioned how many children they have. Therefore, staying home in bed seems like a much easier decision.

Women who lost their only child understandably struggle with their identity as a mom. They wonder, "Am I really a mother?" Of course, my answer is a resounding, "Yes!" But those who have never experienced the death of a baby or are not sympathetically compassionate to our type of loss may unintentionally hurtfully disagree. Thus, the immense pain many women endure on this second Sunday in May every year.

Not only do I feel moms who have had a child die are indeed mothers, I think they (we) are in fact, heroes. As a woman, we have that innately overwhelming desire to be a wife and a mom. When that doesn't happen the way we think it should, we fight feeling like less of a woman, even feeling guilty that our body did not do what it was supposed to do (in most of our cases). Many moms think they are the greatest, most heroic women ever just because they get through the day without losing their temper with their disobedient children. Or because their laundry is caught up. Or because their kitchens and bathrooms are clean. While those are truly victorious feats for ladies, we moms who have seen an unmoving child on a sonogram screen, delivered a silent baby, held a lifeless infant, and buried our dead children...may I say, we are the real heroes!

Over time we move on, put the pieces of our broken lives back together again, find our new normal, and survive. Yes, there are days when we do not feel like we will make it, especially in the early days of raw grief. But if you are reading this article...you have made it to another minute, another hour, another day. You will survive, you will make it, and you will get through these horrible days of sorrow—not unscathed, but you will really be okay one day.

Mother's Day will always have a sting attached to it, no matter how many years go by. But, I assure you that one Sunday in May you truly will be happy again and will be able to get through the day with a smile on your face, and even joyfully attend church again. In the meantime, hold your head high, and consider yourself a hero and absolutely a mother!

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The Heart of the Leader

My name is Jennie Drude. On December 13, 2007, I went in for my first ultrasound, with my first pregnancy, with my first daughter. After a few minutes of struggling to find out the sex of our baby, the ultrasound tech left the room to "get more paper" and returned with my doctor. He took a quick look at the ultrasound and asked my husband to sit down. He told us our baby had anencephaly, which is a neural tube defects that occurs in the first 23-28 days after conception. His next words were, "This baby is not going to make it." My heart was broken! I sobbed and sobbed for what seemed like hours. After lots of research and planning and prayer we decided to have a scheduled c-section at 36 weeks. Dharma Lucille was born March 31, 2008, and lived for 21 hours and 22 minutes. We were lovingly able to donate her heart valves to help others.

Although we had the best Christian doctors, a supportive church family and caring biological families, I still felt very alone and crazy! My arms were hurting, I heard babies cry in my sleep, and I was bargaining with God to give me a few more minutes with my baby. Praise God I found Man Non-Houston. I went to my first meeting in May and loved it! I found a whole new family who understood me, and, helped me to realize I was not crazy! I felt a huge weight lifted off of me after that first meeting. I continued to attend every meeting for many, many months. I developed life-long friendships with amazing Godly women. While working in the College Station, Texas, area, I found an urgent need for a MEND chapter. Jaimie Crump, director of MEND—Houston, encouraged me to pray about starting a chapter. Fast forward to today, and M.E.N.D.—Bryan/College Station has now been open three years and is growing every month. I am so honored to be chosen by God to be part of this wonderful ministry. God has used Dharma's life to bring Him so much glory, and I would not change any of it for anything!

By CJ Braden

In A Peace at a Time, author C.J. Braden chronicles her spiritual journey from knowledge of an impersonal God to a personal relationship with THE God. No Mother's Day

May 13, 2012, was my very first Mother's Day, a mere 45 days after the birth of my stillborn son. I was suffering from feelings of guilt, of not feeling like a "true" mother and still wading through the initial shock of our loss. My husband Gary wanted to make the day special, complete with a lunch date, gifts...the works. I think it was an attempt to shake my feelings of incompetence.

A couple days before Mother's Day, I was watching TV and saw a commercial for the "No Mother's Day" campaign. It was a short video trying to raise awareness for maternal mortality. Mothers were asked to take a moment to remember the women who never got to celebrate a Mother's Day. They were encouraged to find their own way to raise awareness for the thousands of women who die in childbirth or from complications during pregnancy.

When Mother's Day finally arrived, I spent the morning starting my own blog dedicated to the memory of my son and to track my grief journey. Most of the rest of the day was spent with my mom. When Gary got home from work, we were off to the cemetery with flowers in hand. It had taken a lot of convincing that I didn't want to do anything but be with my baby. As I was sitting there, a warmth came over me. I lay next to Gabriel's grave, and despite the tears, I felt at peace. Ideas to Get Through the Day

What to do on Mother's Day and Father's Day is always a topic in our support groups this time of year. If these are your first holidays since the loss of your baby or babies, it can be particularly difficult to know what to do. We gathered a few of the ideas that have come up in our meetings. Perhaps one or more of the ideas will help you think of how you might spend those days.

Places you may want to avoid

- Restaurants are packed on holidays with families and kids, so it may be better to pack a picnic, try a new recipe or order takeout.
- Family gatherings can be tricky. Many times families have traditions of getting together at one house for a big family lunch or get-together. This can be particularly difficult if you come from a large family with lots of nieces and nephews or new babies/expectant moms. Many couples choose to skip the family gathering, at least the first year. If you are dreading the family meal, let your family know ahead of time not to expect you. You can always change your mind and go at the last minute. Dads, if the gathering is at your mom's house, by all means please be the "bad guy" in this instance to call and decline this year's meal. However, if being surrounded by family would be comforting to you, offer to bring some special flowers for a centerpiece or a candle to light in remembrance of your baby.
- Church—Most bereaved parents say services on these days are particularly painful. Services often focus on being a mom or dad. Usually, there are times of recognition where moms or dads are asked to stand. This leaves moms/dads without living children uncertain of what to do. There are often baby dedications. It may be a day to stay home from church and spend your own time in worship and Bible study or watch a sermon online. If future years, you may think about approaching your pastor about having a special prayer for grieving mothers and fathers or those who are struggling with infertility. One year at our church, there was a group of women who gathered during service to pray for these families.

IDEAS OF WHAT TO DO

Places to Go

- A quiet day at home is always an option, although for some it can lead to more feelings of sadness than if you got out. It can be a very relaxing day sleeping in, eating a late breakfast, reading, working on a project (see ideas below) or napping.
- Get out in nature—Find a nice, quiet place to hike or pack a picnic or find a state park to enjoy.
- Theme parks—Many families have stated they spend one or both of these days at a theme park or water park in the area. You will find that especially on Mother's Day, places that are usually streaming with kids will not be. Most moms will not choose a theme park as her ideal way to spend Mother's Day. She gets the "day off," and babyless parents get the parks almost to themselves.
- Visit a beautiful place, be it a botanical garden or a museum. Just be sure to check to see if they will be open on the holiday.

Things to Do

- This can be a great day to work on a project that celebrates your children, all of them.
- Make a family sign—There are lots of ideas online for family signs with your last name and the names of parents and children.
- Make a garden stone—Your local craft store has easy kits and ideas for how to do this. This might be in in memory of
 your baby or to celebrate your entire family. You may choose to add your baby's name or a representation, like a flower
 or a butterfly.
- Write a letter—Take some time to write a letter to your baby saying how proud you are to be his/her mommy or daddy, how your life has changed, how your love for others has changed. It may be just for you or to read to a friend.
- Plant some flowers—Always a great way to bring some color and joy to a perhaps dark day. Start a memorial garden, be it a large spot or just a few flower pots. This can be a special place to sit and remember your baby.
- Make a keepsake animal—Perhaps you have been wanting to go make a stuffed animal, but didn't want all the kids around. Today might be the perfect day since few people will be there.
- Craft—Whether you are a painter, a writer, a quilter, find a way to celebrate your family.
- If you just want to be busy that day, you can always clean the garage, clean out a closet, weed your flower beds—whatever will keep your mind and hands occupied.

Give

- Another great way to celebrate being a mom or dad is to express love for your baby by giving to others.
- Online donations—Find an organization that provides food or medical care to babies living in poverty or provides pregnancy care and/or birth assistance to mothers who might otherwise not have any. Sparing another mother the pain and grief of losing a baby is particularly meaningful. And of course, donations to M.E.N.D. are always appreciated!

Día de la Madre

El día de la madre es el segundo domingo de mayo, un día en que las mujeres de todo Estados Unidos celebran a sus mamás y son celebradas ellas mismas, "si ellas también son la madre de un niño vivo." Sin embargo, este día es terriblemente difícil para las mujeres que han perdido a un niño, o sufren de infertilidad, y/o han experimentado la muerte de su propia madre.

Nosotros quienes hemos sufrido la muerte de un bebé, incluso si nosotros tenemos uno o más hijos vivos, no queremos arruinar este día de fiesta especialmente para las mujeres quien ingenuamente gozan este día y que nunca han experimentado una pérdida. Pero pedimos que reconozcan la emoción dolorosa, especialmente en nuestras iglesias donde la celebración parece ser la más grande, y donde debemos encontrar un santuario para nuestro dolor. Innumerables mujeres optan por no asistir la iglesia este domingo en particular, simplemente porque lo encuentran demasiado doloroso para sentarse a través del reconocimiento de las madres con la mayoría de los niños, la mamá más grande en edad y otros muchos "premios." No sabe si sé debe levantar, cuando se le pide a las mamás aceptar una rosa de reconocimiento o "contar" del bebé que perdieron cuando se le pregunta cuántos hijos tienen. Por lo tanto, quedarse en casa en la cama parece una decisión mucho más fácil.

Mujeres que perdieron a su único hijo es comprensible que luchen con su identidad como mamá. Se preguntan, "¿Soy realmente una madre?" Por supuesto, mi respuesta es un rotundo "¡sí!" Pero aquellos que nunca han experimentado la muerte de un bebé o no son simpáticamente compasivos a nuestro tipo de pérdida involuntaria, lastimosamente no están de acuerdo. Es por eso que vemos el inmenso dolor que muchas mujeres sufren en este segundo domingo de mayo cada año.

No sólo creo que las madres que han tenido una perdida son en efecto madres, incluso creo que de hecho, son (somos) héroes. Como mujer, tenemos innatamente un inmenso deseo de ser esposa y madre. Cuando eso no ocurre de la manera que debería, luchamos con la sensación de ser menos que una mujer, incluso nos sentimos culpables de que nuestro cuerpo no hizo lo que debía (en la mayoría de los casos). Muchas madres piensan que son las mujeres más grandes, las más heroicas, sólo porque pasaron todo el día sin perder el genio con sus desobedientes hijos, o porque termino de lavar toda la ropa, o porque sus cocinas y baños están limpios. Mientras que son hazañas verdaderamente victoriosos para damas, nosotros, como las madres que han visto a nuestro niño inmóvil en una pantalla de ultra sonido, o hemos entregado a nuestro bebé silencioso, o tenido a nuestro bebé sin vida y enterrado a nuestro niño muerto... nosotros somos las verdaderas héroes!

Con el tiempo seguimos adelante, y tratamos de poner las piezas rotas de nuestras vidas juntas otra vez, buscamos nuestra nueva normalidad y sobrevivimos. Sí, hay días cuando no nos sentimos como que podemos sobrevivir, especialmente en los primeros días del crudo dolor. Pero si estás leyendo este artículo... has logrado llegar a otro minuto, otra hora, otro día. Sobrevivirá, si lo hará, y sobrevivirá a través de estos horribles días de tristeza. No sin herida pero de verdad, usted va a estar bien algún día.

El día de la madre siempre tendrá una cadena fijada a esto, no importa cuántos años han pasado. - Your words—As someone who understands the grief around these holidays, your words can be valuable to another hurting mom or dad. Particularly if this isn't your first Mother's/Father's Day post-loss, writing a note to another mom or dad who has recently lost a baby is incredibly special. Think of how you would feel to receive a note of encouragement. It may not even be a parent who lost a baby. Perhaps you know a mom or dad who lost an adult child this past year. Even sending a short note to validate another's grief this year will validate yours, as well.
- Finally a word to all the moms: often the dads in our groups share that they don't want to do anything big. Perhaps their idea of how to spend the day is going fishing, playing video games, hiking, or working on the car. Give them some space and some grace. They might just need to get away. Ask them what they want to do and help make it happen.
