



Mommies Enduring Neonatal Death

Social Network Grieving

My son, Jonathan, was stillborn in 1995—a time when the Internet was just getting off the ground. In fact, while I was on bed rest when pregnant with Jonathan, I remember watching a commercial that showed a man at his desk ordering flowers for his wife, making dinner reservations and booking an airline flight with seemingly just a few clicks of his mouse, all while looking at his computer screen. At the time, I did not even know what a "mouse" was, and I honestly thought the commercial was a bit far-reaching—impossible, really.

A couple of months after Jonathan's stillbirth, I decided we needed a computer at home for some reason. I remember the first time I turned it on. I had no idea what in the world to do next. It was an impulsive purchase. We were so grief-stricken that we weren't thinking clearly when we bought it. Why on earth would we need such a huge gadget in the corner of our bedroom? I remember calling my husband, Byron, at his office that day and telling him to just take it back. It was a stupid thing we had done and a waste of about \$2,000. We kept it anyway and decided to join the World Wide Web (WWW). Oh, what a new world that opened for me! Back then, chat rooms were very popular, yet we were all warned of the many dangers of "talking" to complete strangers. I stayed away from that particular means of communication, but I was somehow introduced to the Listserv, Infanlos. There I met numerous women from all over the world who had suffered the death of a baby. It was through my computer that I was finally able to pour out my heart to women who truly knew and understood what I was going through. I'd stay up until all hours of the night communicating with my new virtual friends, telling them things about my grief that I had not told a soul. They got it and oftentimes told me they felt the same way. It was extremely healing and therapeutic.

Months later, I felt compelled to bring what I experienced in cyberspace into the real world. I figured

if typing to a computer screen was helpful, surely meeting fellow grieving moms face-to-face would be much better. So, that's kind of what happened—much of how M.E.N.D. was birthed, nearly 17 years ago.

M.E.N.D. was in existence for several months before we had a presence on the World Wide Web. Our good friends, Max and Jody Friz, who had suffered some miscarriages before we lost Jonathan, offered to create and maintain a website for M.E.N.D. Once the website launched, M.E.N.D. escalated to a whole new level. We then had women from all over the world learning about our ministry. The website eventually offered a guest book, which enabled families to post their stories and their email addresses if they wanted readers to contact them. It's funny how what was at one time so incredibly helpful and healing is now completely obsolete.

About four years ago, one of our board members, Amber Zuckerman, who we affectionately refer to as our "computer geek," began a M. \(\subseteq \). \(\subseteq \). \(\subseteq \). \(\subseteq \) Facebook page. I was not on Facebook at the time, nor did I have any intention of drowning myself in something of the sort. However, for about two years I kept hearing comments such as, "did you see what so-and-so posted on Facebook....?" I eventually realized I was very much out of the loop within the ministry that I founded and directed. One night while Amber was sitting at my kitchen table with her laptop at a M.□.N.D. board meeting, she began pounding away on her keyboard then announced, "Okay, Rebekah. You have a Facebook account now." What?? I didn't even ask her or tell her it was okay. Once I learned how to navigate my way through Facebook, though, I was hooked! But more importantly, I saw how vital our M.E.N.D. page was for grieving families. Multiple times a day I read through the many posts on our $M. \sqsubseteq N. D$. page. Not only did I

The Heart of the Leader

My name is Amber Zuckerman. In December 2003, I was diagnosed with PCOS and told that I may never have children. I was devastated at this thought, but I trusted that this could not be God's plan. After some medical heroics, we were pregnant just six weeks after being told this news. Under the watchful eye of my doctor, we delivered our first son, Eli, in October 2004. We were told when we were ready to try again to call our doctor to repeat the magic formula.

Much to our surprise, without medical heroics, we found out we were expecting again in August 2006. Both surprised and excited, we moved through this pregnancy without incident, healthy and on track. On March 29, 2007, I went into labor and we headed to the hospital to bring our baby boy home. In the still of that night, monitor after monitor, nurse after nurse, tear upon tear, we were told that our AJ's heart had stopped beating. At 5:28 a.m. on March 30, Adrian Joseph "AJ" was born still in silence due to a nuchal cord x2 and a true knot in his umbilical cord.

Two weeks after AJ died, we were sitting in our first M.E.N.D. meeting and for the first time we felt validated for the emotions, thoughts and desperation we had been experiencing. We attended religiously each month and quickly knew that M.E.N.D. would forever be a part of our journey and our lives. As soon as Rebekah would let me, I began serving on the Walk and Christmas committees, fundraising, organizing raffles and administering M.E.N.D.'s social media presence. Today, I proudly serve on the board of directors and as the event fundraising coordinator.

Through M.E.N.D., we were able to regain our strength, define our new normal, and have over time been able to appreciate God's perfect plan. In April 2009, we welcomed AJ's hand-picked little brother, Alexander, to our family. When asked how many children we have, we say we have three boys: two on earth and one in heaven. I'm thankful God trusts me enough to share our little slice of heaven on earth through M.E.N.D.

A Way to Grieve

Losing Rylan happened too fast for me to even process the whole situation. One morning I woke up and went to work like any other day, and by that night I was in the ER with a ruptured tube, internal bleeding, medicated on whatever they would give me to make the pain go away. And by that next morning I wasn't pregnant anymore.

Post-surgery left me curled up in my bed with the laptop. There isn't a whole lot to do on bed rest, and not much else that you are thinking about when you have a loss. I spent endless hours on every website I could get to. I looked up the answers to every question I could think of—would it happen again? what are the risk factors when I get pregnant again? is there anything out there to help? is this or that normal?

Of course, the "why" can never be answered. No matter how many times I searched couldn't find anything that gave me comfort. That was the question that I wanted answered more than anything, but I know now that it won't ever be answered in a way that I want.

So instead, I started blogging. It's easier to deal with the pain when someone isn't looking at me, isn't expecting me to say something, isn't watching every tear, doesn't try to interject their thoughts when I just need a moment to think. It is easier to collect what I want to say and deal with unsuspecting surprises that come up. I can process my own thoughts and come back to it later. I don't feel out in the open, I feel like I can share with everyone at the same time something that hurt instead of reliving it every time a friend calls.

But most of all, I feel like I can just survive. Because even if no one else wants to talk about Rylan, I know I have a place to go where I can say anything I want whenever I want. I can unleash my sadness without fear of judging eyes. I can hash out my emotions and figure out how I'm doing without the pressure of coming up with an answer in a moment's notice. It's my way to grieve, to remember, to feel. If I share it and it helps someone else, that's really the second most important reason why I started it.

Seven years have gone by since we lost our daughter, Alivia, holding her in our arms so lifeless and still. I have found that the pain is still there, but now it feels so different. I can recall days after her loss of my heart being so heavy with grief that it felt like I had a stack of bricks on my chest. Now seven years later it still hurts, but it is not so heavy. I have found that as we go through and grow in our loss, we tend to think we do not need the support of others as much or not at all. We can reach out and love on others, but we are able to handle things dealing with our own losses on our own. This is especially true when you are part of the boards or committees in the groups we are a part of. We have to realize that we need support at times, and it is okay because grief has no friends; we are friends to each other and are here to lift each other up.







On December 11, 2007, we found out we were having a girl, found out she sucked her thumb in the womb and, unfortunately, found out she had anencephaly and found out she "would not make it." Upon returning home we immediately were on our computers to learn about what our baby had. For a word we had never heard, Google presented thousands of hits.

One of the first things we found was a Yahoo support group for moms who are or have been pregnant with babies with anencephaly and carried to term or as long as they could. There were about 300 members from all around the globe. I introduced myself and the ladies covered me with prayers and kind words. They were also very honest and realistic. All the moms were Biblebelieving Christians, which was so amazing. They walked with me and held my virtual hand for the rest of my pregnancy. The administrators even sent flowers to Dharma's funeral! I became Facebook friends with many and still keep in touch. One friend, whom I have never met, sent me a personal bracelet for Dharma's birthday.

The ladies in this group held my hand until I was ready for face-to-face support through M.E.N.D. The "live" support group helped me connect to other moms who made me realize I was not crazy and that I was still a mom. The Yahoo group is now a Facebook group called anencephaly.info. It is still a wonderful group, and I am so thankful for them. It is a safe place to share photos, feelings, frustrations and prayer requests.

realize how great it was to have a place for bereaved families to pour out their hearts, but it was also a wonderful vehicle for families to minister to and encourage fellow grieving moms. It didn't take long before I made an executive decision that all chapters of M.E.N.D. must have their own Facebook pages. Admittedly, we've had some issues that we've had to learn how to troubleshoot and at times we have to delete some inappropriate posts and even block a few people, but the ministry and the good far outweigh the bad. Our Facebook pages are safe places where families from all over the world can express themselves and share their little ones with a group of people who understand and will not respond with hurtful reactions. Additionally, a M.E.N.D. Facebook page is an ideal place to share photos and special mementos without fearing uncomfortable comments might follow.

It has been 18 years since I was in the deep, dark throes of grief—at a time when expressing our sorrow publicly was just becoming acceptable. Today, those who are freshly grieving have an immense advantage in utilizing social networking to make their emotions known. I so wish what is available now had been more available then. Open Doors

We all have memories that we hold precious and dear to our hearts, no matter how brief our time was with our little ones. These moments are sacred, cherished beyond measure and are guarded safely for a choice few. Our stories are personal tragedies, painted pictures of worlds falling apart. We don't look for pity, but rather recognition that our baby(ies) existed. We are faced with questions that cause an inner debate on whether we tell about our nightmares or just give a simple lie as an answer.

We live in the technological age, where information is a click away and phone calls are almost a thing of the past. In a world ruled by social media, how can our grief fit? Child loss, though it is gaining positive support, is still a very taboo subject. After keeping my Facebook "friends" updated throughout my entire pregnancy, I panicked after we lost Gabriel. I didn't know if I should ever log in to my account again, because what could I say? I didn't want to go into details, and I didn't want to hear the apologies or condolences, but I knew no matter how sugar-coated the story was, questions would come.

I won't lie—it hasn't been easy navigating the murky waters of social media. When you sit behind an emotionless computer screen, it can be hard to determine who is friend or foe. I scrutinized every comment, every question. I lost people who I thought were friends and even received negative feedback when I shared Gabriel's pictures. Though it wasn't an easy path, especially during the early storm of grief, my choices have led to my own safe haven.

I have always loved writing. It is a way for me to get my feelings out where, in other situations, words have failed me. I questioned why my story shouldn't be heard. Why should I be made to feel as even less of a mother because other people were uncomfortable with reality? A drive was born within me—I needed to get these emotions out! It started with my own private group on Facebook; this way I could add who I wanted with safety. At first it was mostly family, and I poured my heart out about the grief roller coaster I had somehow ended up on. It wasn't always pretty, but it was true, it was raw and sometimes even dark. I half expected to be under lock and key because of some of the things I posted, but as we all know, the first year is the hardest. To my surprise I was encouraged to share my story, I was a "hero" for not hiding behind a silly mask. Eventually I even began to write on my own Facebook page, share pictures every once in a while, and after a few minor setbacks, I finally felt I could be true to myself.

Social media wasn't always nice to me. When hiding behind a computer screen people often show their true feelings and say things they wouldn't dare say to your face. But I have gained so much support. Not only can I be myself, but I can even go back to the posts about my pregnancy and just remember those beautiful moments. I consider my Facebook a living timeline. Social media has also led to my own public blog about my grief journey, and it continues to amaze me that every month there are more and more people coming across Gabriel's story.

Somewhere people are listening. They aren't turning a blind eye to the truth and to me, and that makes every trial I have endured to get to this point worth it. I won't be made to believe that because Gabriel isn't "here" he never existed. I won't be pushed back into the corner, because my son did matter; your children matter, and the silence needs to be broken. Even if it is in a small way, my story is making a difference. I don't think I could have made even this much of an impact without the technology we have today.

M.E.N.D. 's Online Presence

In keeping up with the changes in technology, M = N = N is excited to reveal our new website. Many changes were made to enhance our website for easier use and navigation. We still have the same address, www.mend.org, but visitors will find these changes.

Top five noticeable changes:

- 1. The new MEND website has been designed in consideration of many readers who are now transitioning to touch-screen tablets (e.g. Apple iPad, Kindle Fire HD, Samsung Galaxy, HP Slate 7) from desktop computers or laptops. Navigation is now easier on both touch-screens and desktops, where previously it was a bit awkward and unreliable on touch screens.
- 2. Any web page on the website can now easily be shared on Facebook, Twitter or Pinterest.
- 3. Individual local chapters of M.E.N.D. will now have a "micro site" format so they can add additional web pages or topics relevant to their chapter (instead of a single web page).
- 4. Google Maps have been embedded in each of our local chapter location pages for easier directional information.
- 5. Resource links are now listed in a format that is much easier to read (also improved for touch screen devices), and will also print better should readers decide to print their web pages.

Important changes that will not be noticeable to the reader, but are worth mentioning:

- 1. Our web hosting provider will change. The new host will provide a technology infrastructure that will allow us to enhance our site capabilities a bit more than we are able to using our previous provider.
- 2. We will be working to integrate a custom search capability that will allow readers to search only the content on our site (coming soon).
- 3. In upcoming years, we hope to have a mobile web site specifically designed for smart phones (e.g. iPhone, Android, Blackberry) that will be easier to navigate on a smaller screen. Note: We are not planning on developing "apps" for these devices, only a mobile web site.

On the 30th of March of this year, we were blessed with our little Lauryn, and I had forgotten about the questions you get from people when you have a new baby. I went to an appointment, and a lady asked the normal questions about her and then the one that affects every mother who has lost a baby: How many children do you have? At times I feel fine to share with people about our loss and other times I do not feel the need to share it, and this day I was on the fence. I told her three: Livi, who is six (at the time), Jaxson who is five and the baby. She said very quickly, "I bet Jaxson is a good helper," but then went on and on about Livi! How she is probably a great helper, a little mama to Lauryn and how her children were spaced out and such good helpers. Sitting there I was trying to determine if I should just burst her bubble with "my Livi died six years ago but I bet she would be" or instead leave it alone and just go with it. I chose to leave it alone and just let her do all the talking. She continued talking, and I felt like I was going to scream, "My life is just not that simple!" Finally, my name was called.

As I left my appointment, I was a bit upset because she was so nosey! I reached out to my fellow MEND. mommies on Facebook and got responses to my frustrations for several days. This community on Facebook helped me to remember that although I do this and that with M.E.N.D. and that I am seven years out from my loss, it is okay if I am hurting or upset about something we face as mothers of heavenly babies, and it is good to reach out for comfort. No matter how long ago your loss was, we, the family of M.E.N.D. are here to support you, and it is a blessing that we can connect through Facebook.

My son, Jonathan, was stillborn in 1995—a time when the Internet was just getting off the ground. In fact, I remember while on bed rest when pregnant with Jonathan, seeing television commercials of a man at his desk ordering flowers for his wife, making dinner reservations, and booking an airline flight with seemingly just a few clicks of his mouse while looking at his computer screen. At the time, I did not even know what a "mouse" was and I honestly thought the commercial was a bit far-reaching – impossible, really.

A couple of months after Jonathan's stillbirth, I decided we needed a computer at home for some reason. I remember the first time I turned it on. I had no idea what in the world to do next. It was an impulsive purchase. We were so grief-stricken that we weren't thinking clearly when we bought it. Why on earth would we need such a huge gadget in the corner of our bedroom? I remember calling my husband, Byron, at his office that day and telling him to just take it back. It was a stupid thing we had done and a waste of about \$2,000. We kept it anyway and decided to join the World Wide Web. Oh, what a new world that opened for me! Back then, chat rooms were very popular, yet we were all warned of the many dangers of "talking" to complete strangers. I stayed away from that particular means of communication, but I was somehow introduced to the Listsery, Infanlos. There, I met numerous women from all over the world who had suffered the death of a baby. It was through my computer that I was finally able to pour out my heart to women who truly knew and understood what I was going through. I'd stay up until all hours of the night communicating with my new virtual friends, telling them things about my grief that I had not told a soul. They got it and oftentimes told me they felt the same way. It was extremely healing and therapeutic.

Months later, I felt compelled to bring what I was involved with in cyberspace into the real world. I figured if typing to a computer screen was helpful, surely meeting fellow grieving moms face-to-face would be much better. So, that's kind of what happened—much of how M.E.N.D. was birthed, nearly 17 years ago.

M.E.N.D. was in existence for several months before we had a presence on the WWW. Byron's and my good friends, Max and Jody Friz, who had suffered a few miscarriages before we lost Jonathan, offered to create and maintain a website for M.E.N.D. Once the website launched, M.E.N.D. escalated to a whole new level. We then had women from all over the world learning about our ministry. The website eventually offered a Guest Book, which enabled families to post their stories and their email addresses if they wanted readers to contact them. It's funny how what was at one time so incredibly helpful and healing is now completely obsolete.

About four years ago, one of our Board Members, Amber Zuckerman, who we affectionately refer to as our "computer geek", began a M.E.N.D. Facebook page. I was not on Facebook at the time, nor did I have any intention of drowning myself in something of the sort. However, for about two years I kept hearing comments such as, "did you see what so-and-so posted on Facebook....?" I eventually realized I was very much out of the loop within the ministry that I founded and directed. One night while Amber was sitting at my kitchen table with her laptop at a M.E.N.D. Board

meeting, she began pounding away on her keyboard then announced, "okay, Rebekah. You have a Facebook account now". What?? I didn't even ask her or tell her it was okay. Once I learned how to navigate my way through Facebook, though, I was hooked! But more importantly, I saw how vital our M. = .N.D. page was for grieving families. Multiple times a day I read through the many posts on our M.E.N.D. page. Not only did I realize how great it was to have a place for bereaved families to pour out their hearts, but it was also a wonderful vehicle for families to minister to and encourage fellow grieving moms. It didn't take long before I made an executive decision that all chapters of M.F.N.D. must have their own Facebook page. Admittedly, we've had some issues that we've had to learn how to troubleshoot and at times we have to delete some inappropriate posts and even block a few people, but the ministry and the good far outweigh the bad. Our Facebook pages are a safe place where families from all over the world can express themselves and share their little ones with a group of people who understand and will not respond with hurtful reactions. Additionally, it is an ideal place to share photos and special mementos without fearing uncomfortable comments might follow.

It has been 18 years since I was in the deep, dark throes of grief – at a time when expressing our sorrow publicly was just becoming acceptable. Today, those freshly grieving have an immense advantage of utilizing Social Networking to make their emotions known. I so wish what is available now had been more available then. If you have not taken advantage of what is "out there" for you, I encourage you to check it out and try it. Join one of the ten M.E.N.D. Facebook pages today (see pageon how to join) and let us help you as you journey down this lonely road of grief.

When AJ died just over six years ago, our support options were face-to-face group meetings or coffee visits, blogging and even snail-mail. I can remember attending my first M.E.N.D. meeting and collecting as many phone numbers as I could from other mothers so I would have a selection of people to call when one of those dreadful grouchy grief days would hit. I needed someone to call who could relate to whatever emotion that moment brought.

And then came Facebook. A place where supporter and supportee could always connect, day or night, good or bad, with almost instant encouragement, comfort and validation for the emotion of the day. Seeing the need that existed amongst our families to connect, MEND established the first official MEND. Facebook group in August 2008. Groups are private, and we ask that everyone review the guidelines for sharing as we attempt to maintain a safe and uplifting environment.

Today, each of the 10 MEND chapters host a Facebook group for its area helping to connect more than 1,500 families. If you would like to join one of the Facebook groups, visit www.mend.org.
