Let us all make a point this Father's Day to recognize our babies' fathers with the same acknowledgement we want from them. Let's also remember that though they may grieve differently than we do, they lost a child too.

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## The Heart of the Leader

When I made "my" plans for my future during my college years, it most certainly did not include burying a child and the long road of grief and depression following. It was a wonderful plan which included a loving husband, the perfect dog, a nice home, two little boys and lots of baseball games. In 2000, "my plan" was on schedule. I had the husband, the dog and the home; it was time to add the children. We were blessed with becoming pregnant right away and later found out we were having a boy ... after all, that was the plan. In November 2000, my life and "my plan" were rocked to the core. My baby boy, Carter Patrick Outen, was stillborn at 32 weeks due to unknown causes.

As you know, words cannot describe the depth of shock, sadness and anger that consumed me. I was determined to get "my plan" back on track. We soon began to try to conceive again and sadly, within the next year, we suffered two early miscarriages. At this point, I was hopeless. I didn't think my body was capable of producing a live baby. I was mad at everyone, myself and God. How could He let this happen? I thought "we" had a great plan, and I thought I was doing all the right things in order to make that happen.

My depression was consuming. Reality set in, and I realized I was not the one in control of the "plan." It was God's plan all along. With some encouragement from my husband, I finally had the strength to attend a M.E.N.D. support group many years ago. At this meeting, I remember a huge weight lifted off my shoulders! I always knew in my heart I was not the only person to go through these tragic losses, and to meet other families in person and hear their stories helped me immensely.

Some women there had been down this same road many years before me and were doing great. After that night, I saw a glimmer of hope for myself. I was determined to move beyond my grief and become one of those women others could look to for hope. It didn't happen overnight, and it certainly wasn't easy, but I finally made it to this point in my life.

Serving on various M.E.N.D. committees and on the board of directors has allowed me to share my experiences and what I have learned along my journey with others. My greatest hope is that someone may see hope through me, just as I saw hope at that support group meeting many years ago. God's plan is not always



our plan, and it definitely took me years to see that His plan is good. I encourage all of you to find a way to become involved in some way with MEND or some other group to honor your baby. The reward for me has been immeasurable.





Return to Zero is based on a true story of a successful couple, played by Paul Adelstein (Aaron Royal) and Minnie Driver (Maggie Royal), who are preparing for the arrival of their first child. Life appears to be picture-perfect, until a few weeks before their due date they receive the devastating news that their baby son has died in the womb and will be stillborn.

Maggie and Aaron attempt to go on about their lives, but as many of us have experienced, they cannot escape their postpartum grief. The loss of this little child forever alters their lives and relationship, to the point that they turn to other ways to handle their grief, through denial, escape, alcohol and even an affair. 

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## Choosing Joy

Mother's Day and Father's Day of 2012 were filled with such joy at our home. My husband got me the Mother's Day card with the big pregnant belly that said, "Kick! Kick! Kick! Translation: Happy Mommy's Day From You-Know-Who!" I must have been around 19 weeks at the time, expecting our first child, and was just starting to feel our little pumpkin's small kicks. As we ate our breakfast in bed, we began to dream of future Mother's Days and what it would be like next year. On Father's Day we visited my husband's parents. I completely forgot to do anything at all for him, but I promised next year would be different. However, 2012 was our only Mother's Day and Father's Day with our firstborn, Kyleigh.

In January 2013, Kyleigh passed away due to SIDS. As Mother's Day and Father's Day 2013 approached, I grew very anxious, as I did with most of our firsts after losing Kyleigh. The thing I struggled with the most was, I honestly did not feel like a mom. No one ever belittled me or just swept her death under the rug, but it was me who felt somehow less than other moms.

My husband was so sweet and brought me breakfast in bed and actually reused the same card since we were expecting our second child, but there was someone obviously missing. We just lay in bed and cried for probably an hour or so, before we got up and went to church. With God's grace, and I am sure hundreds of prayers from my friends and family, church was not a bad thing. We came home, and I don't even remember the rest of the day; I probably just slept. What was surprising for me is how hard Father's Day was. I really wanted to do something for Kyle. I wanted to make Father's Day as normal as possible, for both my husband and I. So my first step was to go shopping for a Father's Day card—BIG MISTAKE! I stood in the card aisle just bawling as I read card after card that just didn't work. I remember screaming in my head, "Where is the card from your deceased daughter!" Needless to say, I got nowhere and left the store more determined than ever to find or make the perfect gift. After lots of thought I finally decided to make him a collage for his office including his scrubs with Kyleigh's footprints, pictures of him and Kyleigh, and a few ultrasound pictures of Baby Rabe #2. I wrote him a letter since I never found a card. Here is a section:

Happy Father's Day, Sweetheart. As Father's Day has drawn closer, I find myself looking at cards for you, wondering what it would be like to have our sweet little chunky 8-month-old here to put her little handprint on it. Without that handprint, a card seemed so empty to me and it seemed so inappropriate to just give you a blank card. What do you do on a Father's Day like this?

Again I don't remember much about the day exactly. I am sure it was more of the same, holding each other while crying, and going to church. The thing I have come to realize after Kyleigh's death is that there are going to be many hard days like Mother's Day and Father's Day, but I get to choose joy. I determine how I will spend this day and how she will be remembered. It may take a little creativity and what we do may seem morbid or weird to outsiders, but one thing Management in had helped me with is to learn to not apologize for my grief or remembering my baby every second of every day. As Mother's Day and Father's Day 2014 are drawing near, I will be looking for a new way to celebrate, all the while missing my sweet pumpkin, Kyleigh.



into church on Mother's Day 2012. From the outside we looked like a complete family, smiling and talking to everyone, and people were wishing me a happy Mother's Day. Some even commented how this was my first Mother's Day as a mom. Only it wasn't. It was my fourth Mother's Day, and fresh in my mind were memories from a year before, on Mother's Day 2011, when I was 32 weeks pregnant with our first son, Gideon. At dinner with my husband, I felt Gideon kicking me, loving that I was eating Italian food. I didn't know just one week later he would die inside of my womb.

I like the fact that a day is set aside each year to honor our moms and dads (or those women and men who assume a parental role in our lives). Mother's and Father's Days are important because our parents play such a vital role to shape and mold us. From the time I was little, I wanted to be a mom. I was the little girl who put balloons and basketballs up her shirt to pretend she was pregnant. I would pretend to nurse my dolls after they were "born." I had so many Cabbage Patch Dolls that were my babies! Anyone who knows me won't be too surprised at that story! I loved babies and kids. I still do.

For years, Mother's Days were torture. We decided in 2007 to start a family, not knowing from then on out, Mother's Day would be a complicated, bittersweet day. Since I focused on Him—on all He has given me. I knew, no that year, it has never been the same.

We began trying to have a baby, and after a year and a half of testing, infertility treatment and IUIs, we finally were expecting a baby! Only too soon, way too soon, we were told we would lose this baby whom we already loved so much. After that loss, participating in Mother's Day was filled with anxiety. I never felt like I belonged. I was a mom but didn't have my baby. No one really recognized me as a mother, so I was left out. But I was a mother! Because the day filled me with dread, I decided to take the focus off of myself, and I made a point to focus on my own mother on Mother's Day. It became more about my mom and the blessing she is in my life, and less about what I didn't have in my life.

God brought about a lot of healing in my heart over the next few years. Even as we continued to struggle with infertility, I was able to celebrate Mother's Day. I focused on the blessings the Lord gave me through the women in my life who had influenced me. I leaned on Him and let Him hold me on those Mother's Day church services.

On Mother's Day 2011, we were finally expecting again.

I looked into the face of my newborn son as I walked As I sat in one of my favorite Italian restaurants in Houston, I felt our son, Gideon, moving all around inside of me. My husband and I talked about how we would be welcoming our son into the world in just a few short weeks. It was the most joyful I had ever felt on a Mother's Day. I smiled back as people smiled at my round belly. I was happy. I didn't know that just one week later, we would hear the words "I'm so sorry." I didn't know that a week and two days later, I would hold the beautiful body of my son in my arms and kiss his face for the first and last time on this earth. I didn't know in just a week, my entire world would crash down around me. Mother's Day would NEVER ever be the same again.

> After losing Gideon, we became pregnant very quickly with our subsequent baby. Mother's Day 2012 was filled with immense joy and deep pain. I ached to have Gideon there with me, but I was so glad his baby brother was in my arms. I felt incomplete. I felt broken. My hand ached to hold the chubby hand of my oldest son. I sat in the church pew that morning and imagined the little red-headed 1-year-old who should have been sitting next to me, as I held his newborn brother. My heart physically hurt. I missed my son! Tears rolled down my face as I knew I really have three children, not just the one people can see. All my emotions were confusing. Happy, sad, joy, pain, all wrapped into one.

> I cried out to God for comfort, I let His peace fall on me. matter what, I would be able to hold my children in my heart and one day I would hold them in my arms. God reminded me no matter how long we get to have our children, they are a blessing and a gift. Psalm 127:3 says, "Children are a gift from the LORD; they are a reward from him." This fact doesn't change if our children died; they are STILL a gift from Him. ALL children are a gift from God, no matter if we have them for five weeks, 33 weeks or for our entire lives. They are blessings. So this Mother's Day and every Mother's Day for the rest of my life, I will focus on the gift the Heavenly Father has given us in Himself. I will praise Him because of the extravagant love He pours on us constantly. And I will be joyful and thank Him because he made me the mom of three children. Today, even though I miss having all of my kids with me, I am blessed and filled with joy.
